- Q.1 According to Yule's interpretation of Chomsky's theory what are the four components of descriptive grammar? Define each of the four components with one example of each component. (20)
- Q.2 Chomsky affirms that all languages are rule-governed. How would you explain this principle, as it applies to languages? You can use any two languages that you know, to elaborate this principle. (10)
- Q.3 a) Write a sentence, point out its head using a tree diagram. (10)
 - b) Use the same sentence to create the sentence node, the NP node and the VP node.
 - c) Use the same sentence, write it according to the rules of labeled bracket diagram.
 - d) What is the modifier in a sentence? Give an example.
 - e) What is an intensifier? Give an example.
- Q.4 a) What is meant by the term transformational generative grammar? Explain with the help of suitable examples. (15)
 - b) What are the recursive rules? Illustrate with examples.
 - c) How would you link recursiveness with creativity?
 - d) What is embedding? Illustrate with an example.

ASSIGNMENT No. 2

 - iii. Language accuracy
 - iv. Language fluency
 - v. Presentation style

You may use transparencies, charts or any other relevant material for impressive presentation with the permission of your tutor.

Research – oriented activity

Attempt one of the following activities:

While learning a language, how does a child set up the parameters of that language in his/her mind? Discuss briefly. As a case study, consider the language learning process of a child you know and elaborate the above concept. Report your findings in the assignment and present verbally in the tutorial.

Or

Discuss some of the theories of language learning in the classroom as discussed in the Cook's article (5668 textbook). Use one of these theories in your classroom to find out its effectiveness in learning a language. Record your observation. Present in the tutorial.
